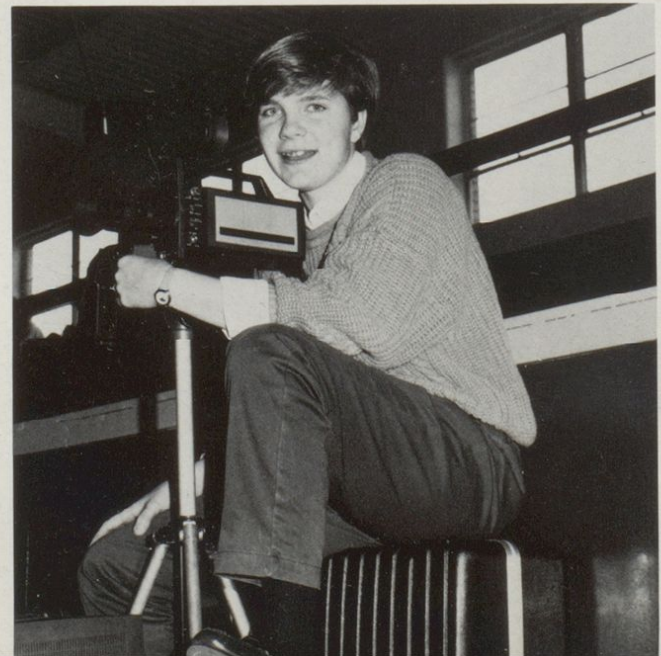

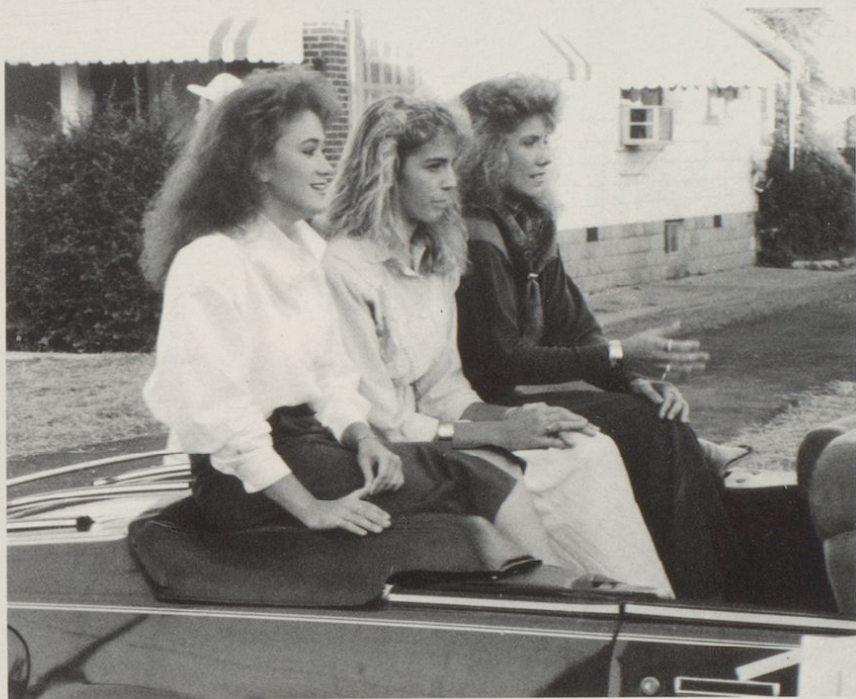

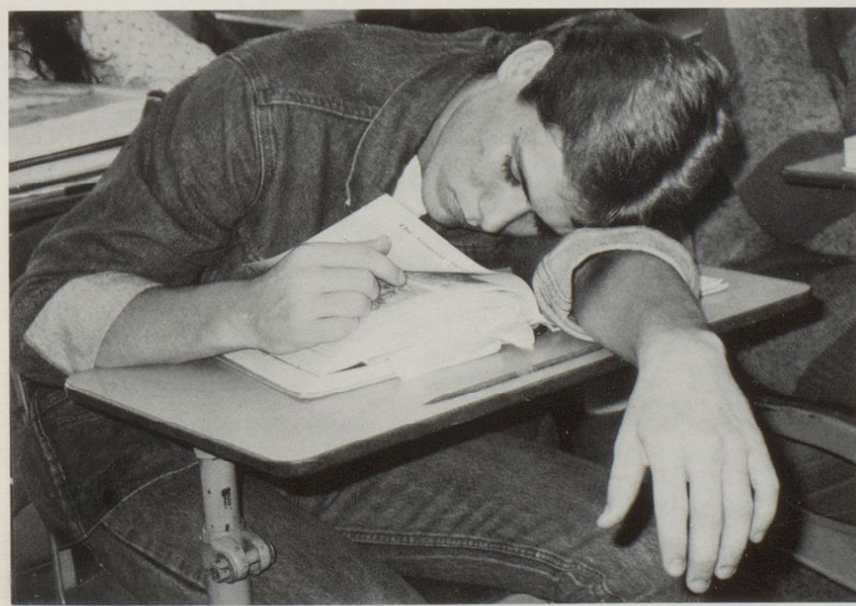

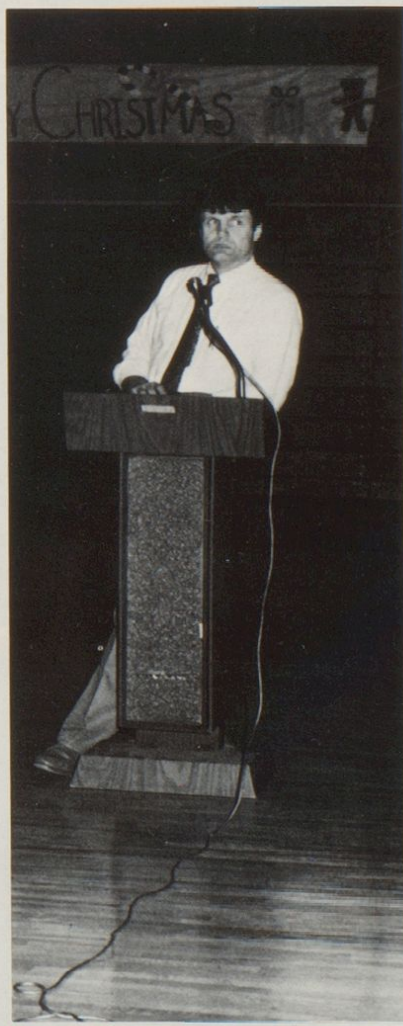

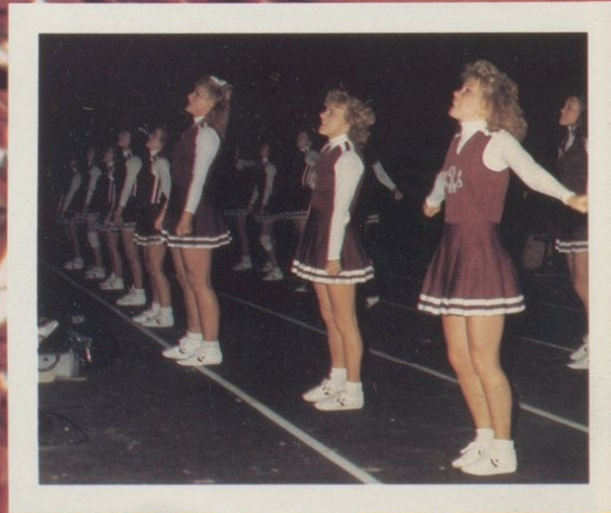

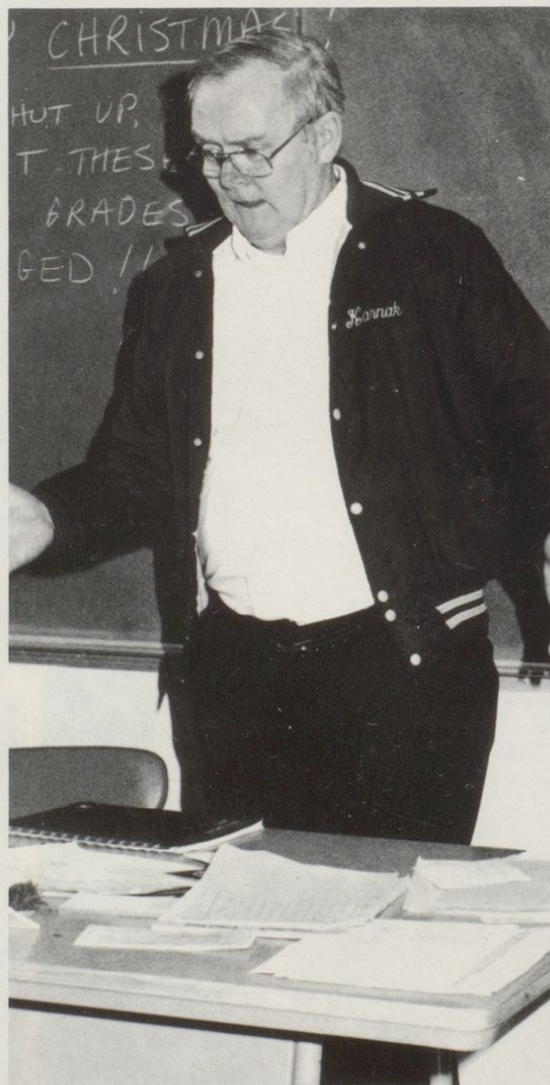




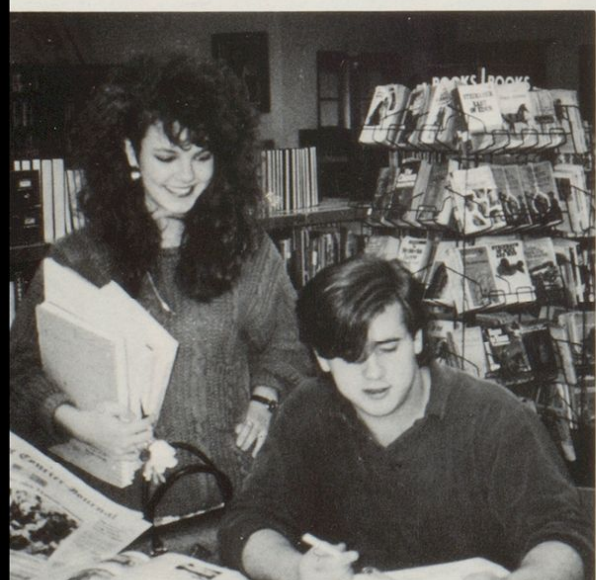

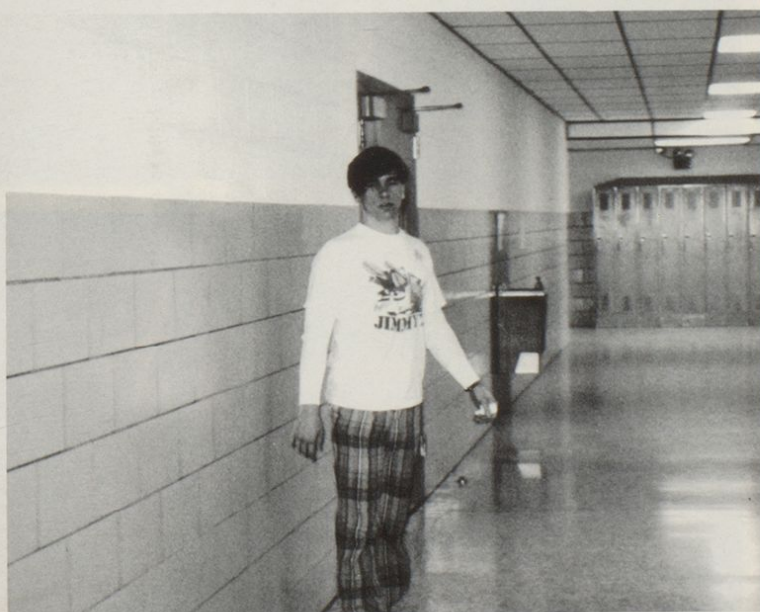

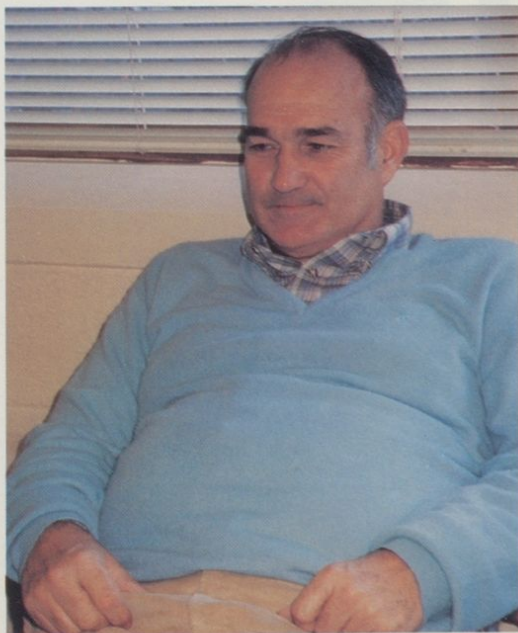

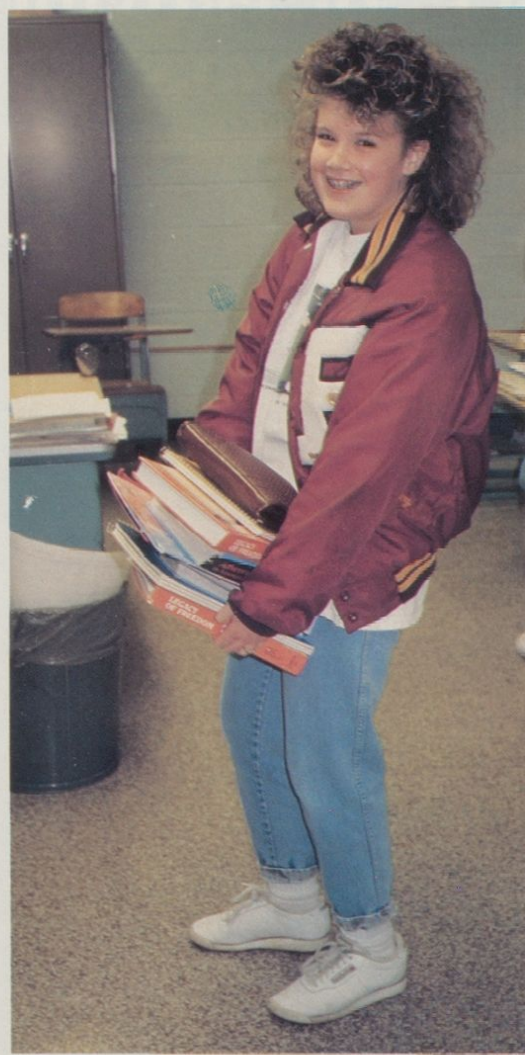

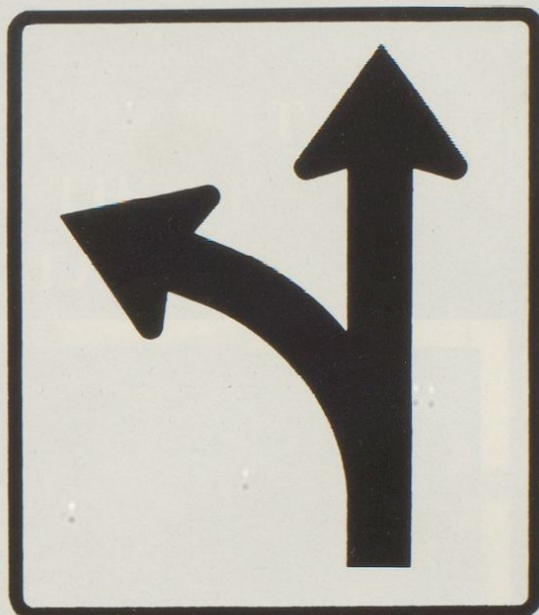

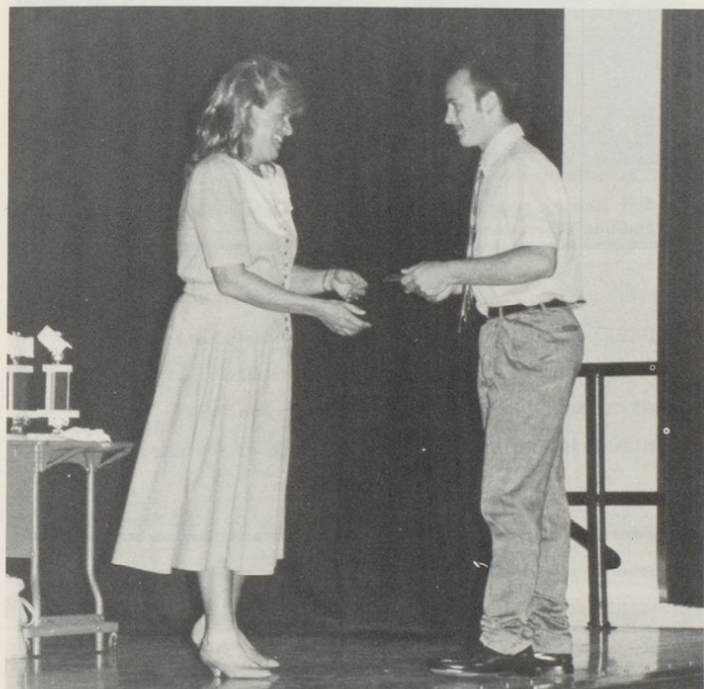

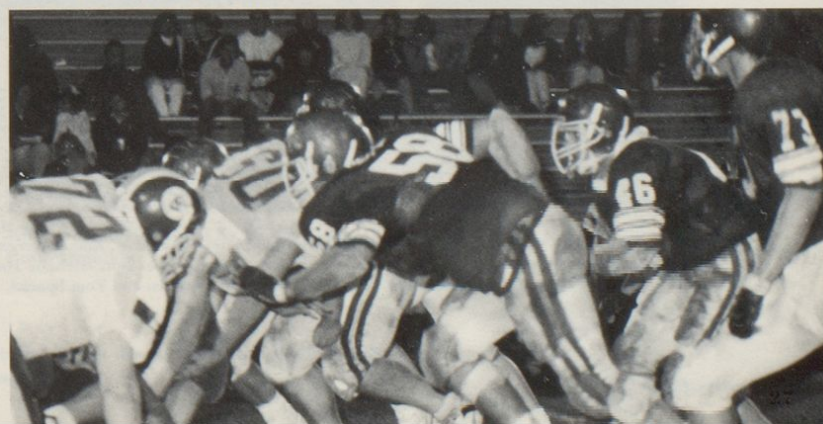

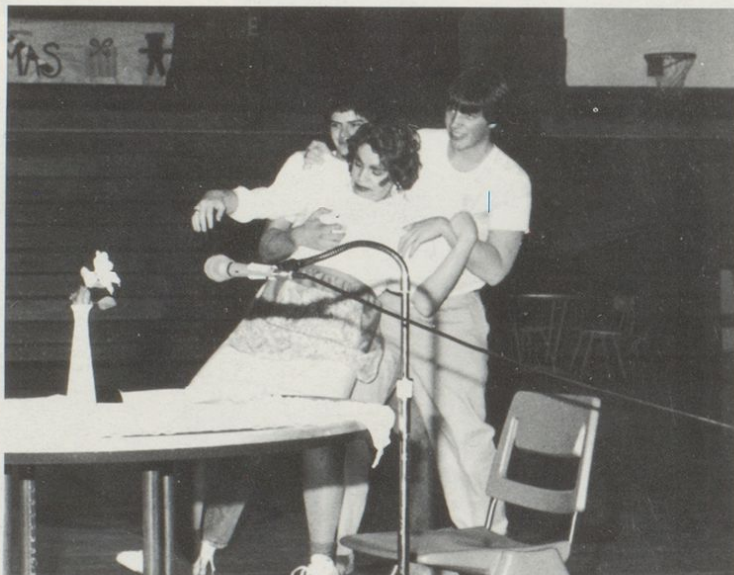


# Beta Variety Show Reveals Hidden

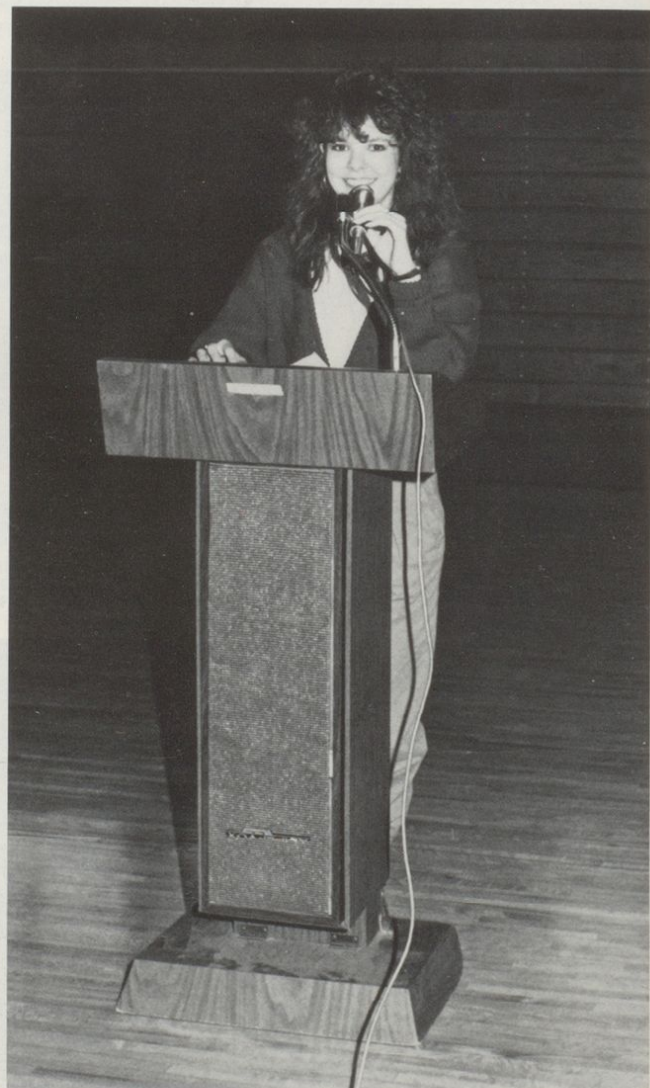

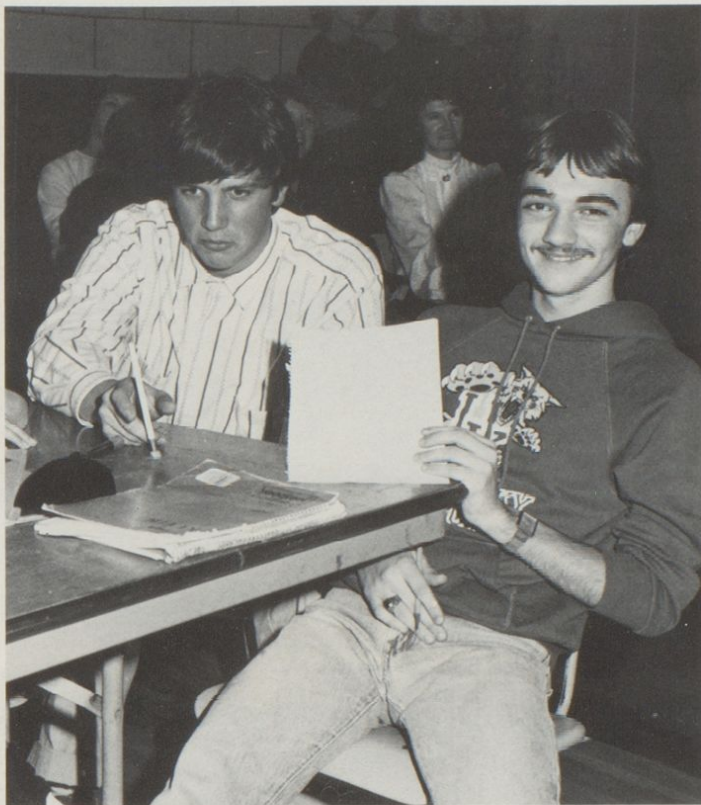

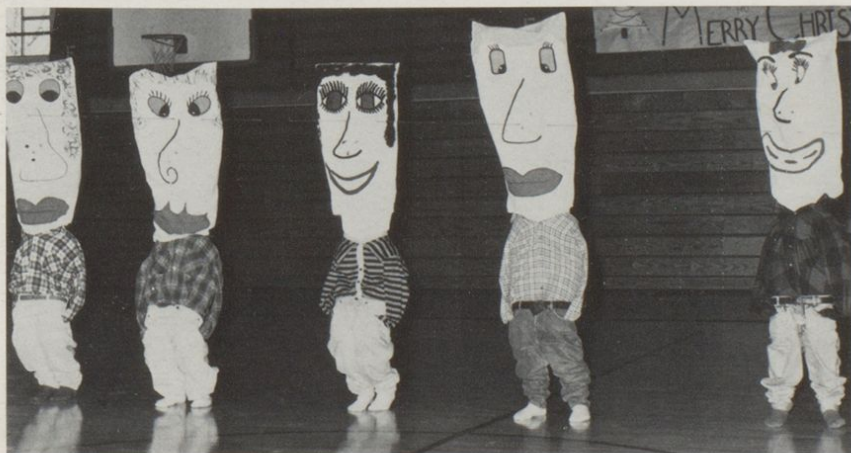

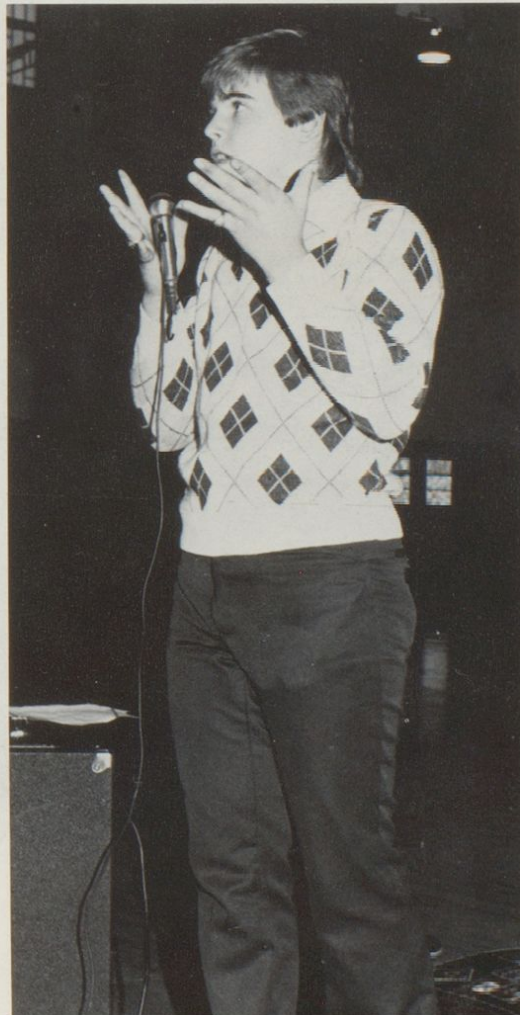

# Jean Dances Provide Yet Another

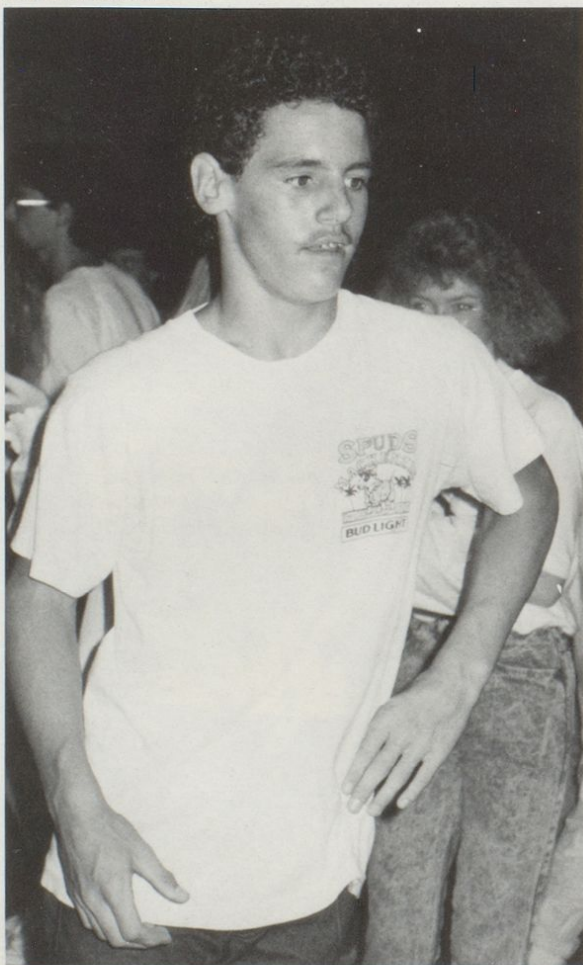

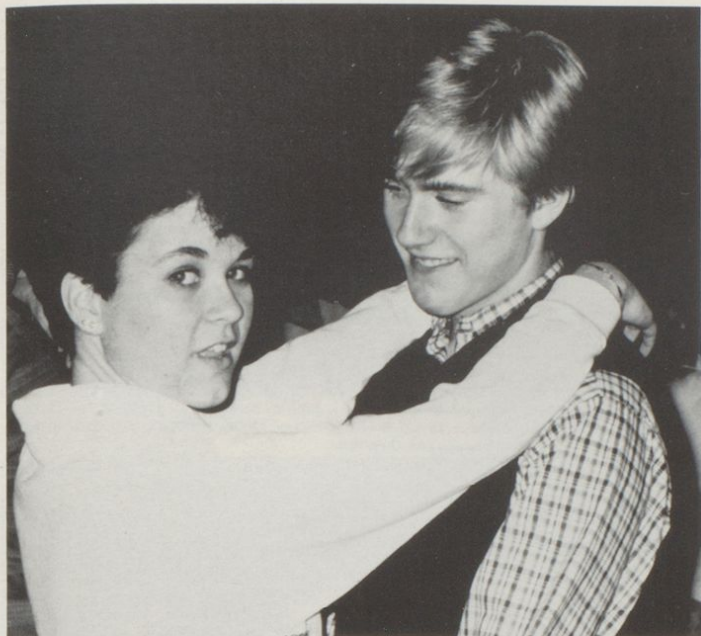

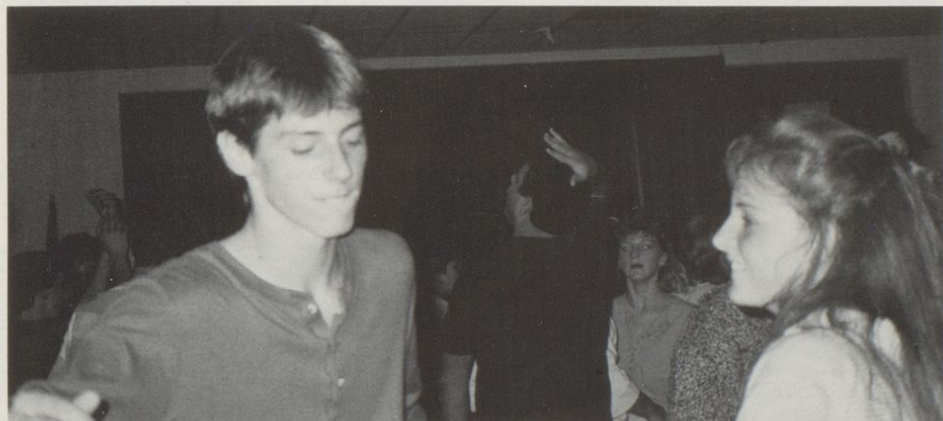
