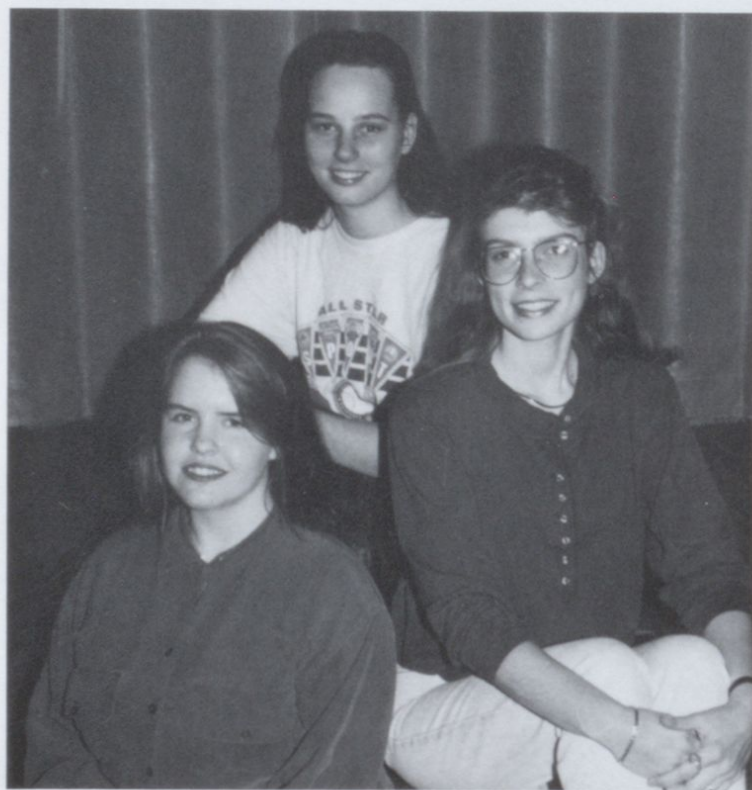

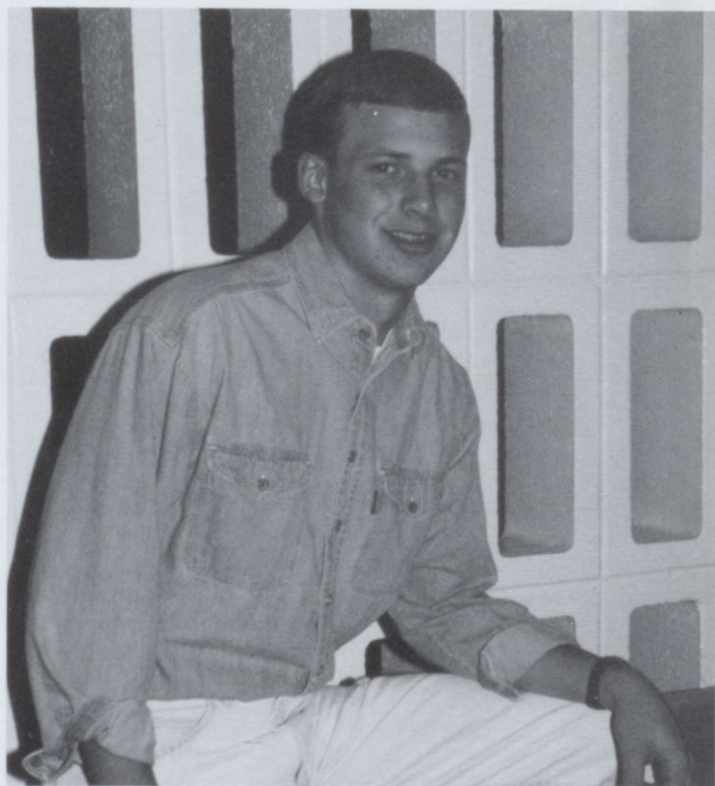
Freshman, Stefanie Fraley was selected from over 100 other applicants to anchor the WOWK Kids Mag program.

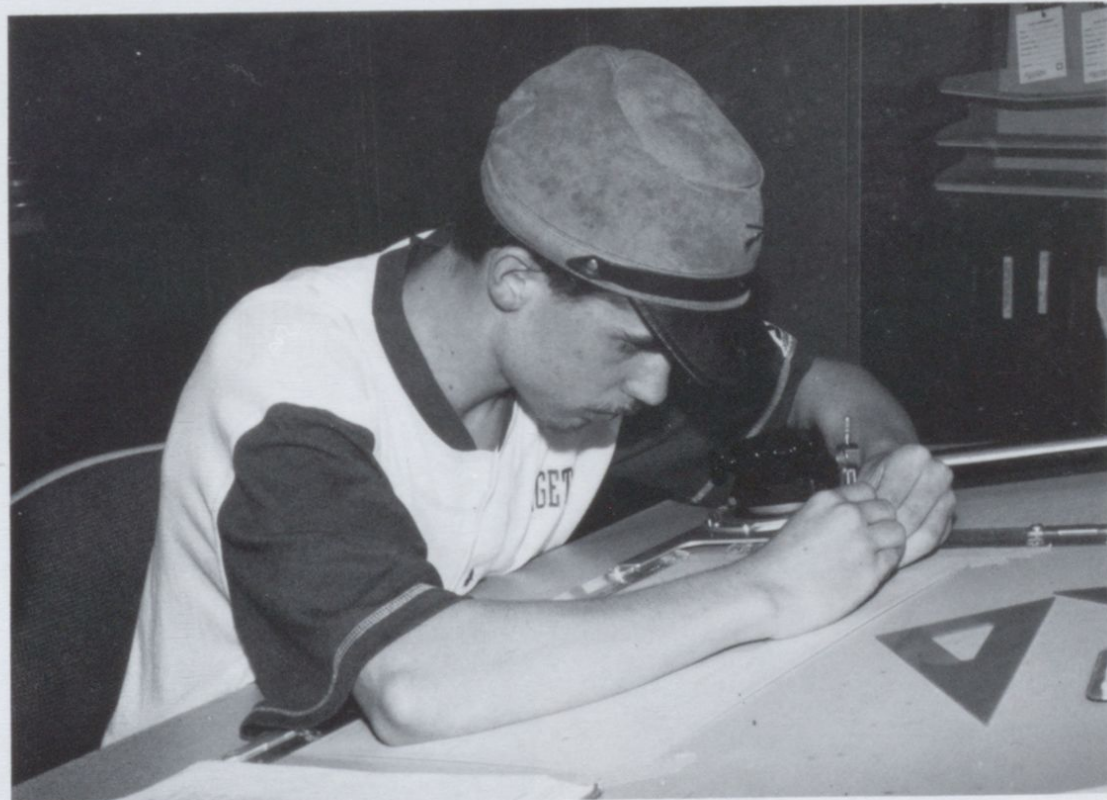
VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL CLASSES

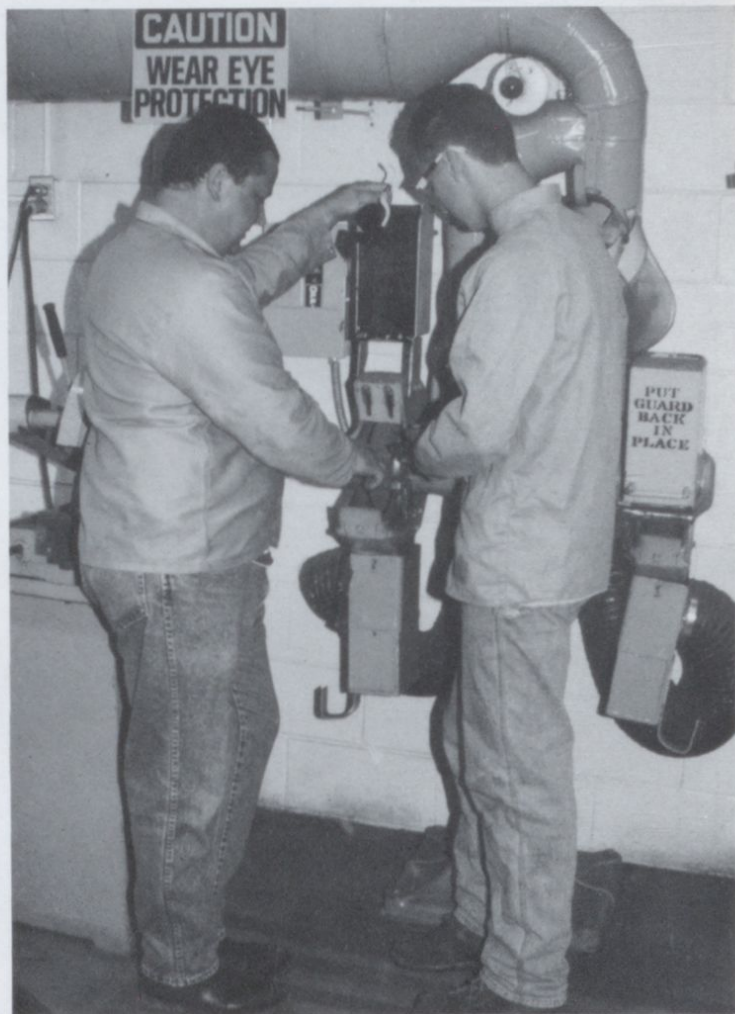

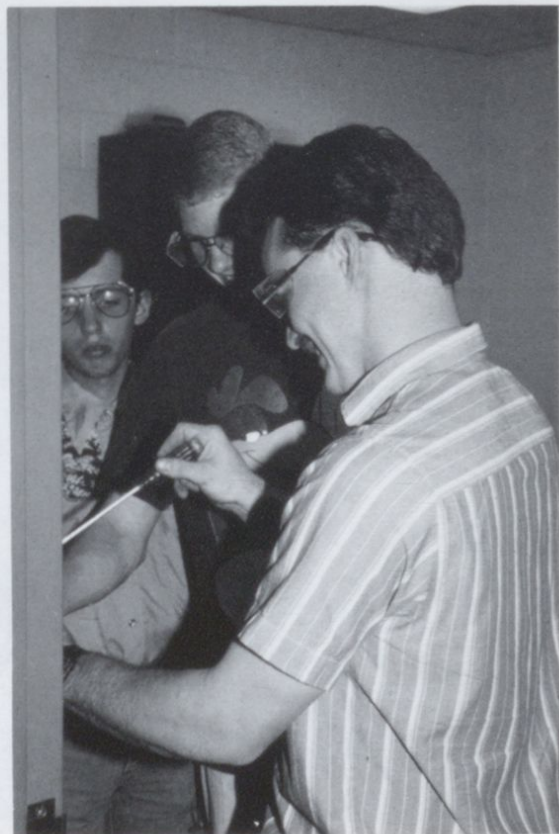

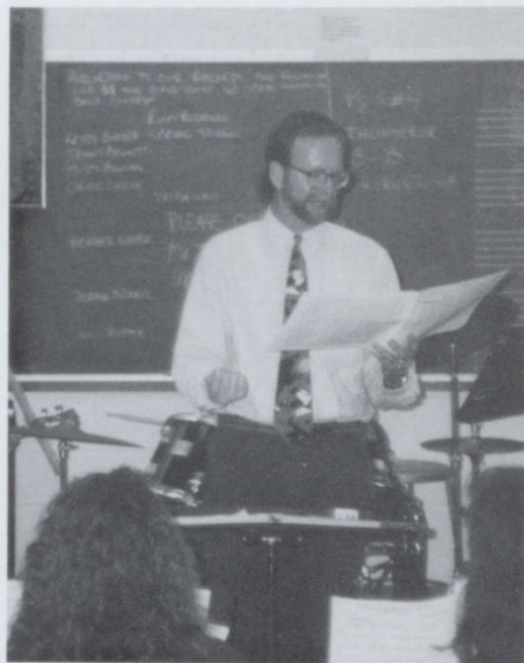


Perfect Timing

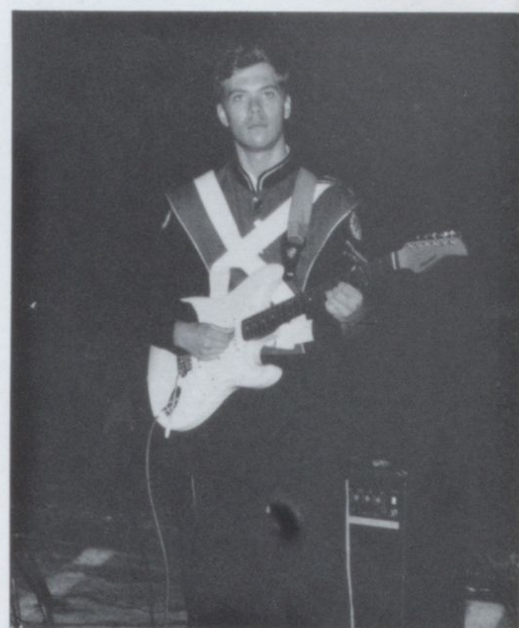

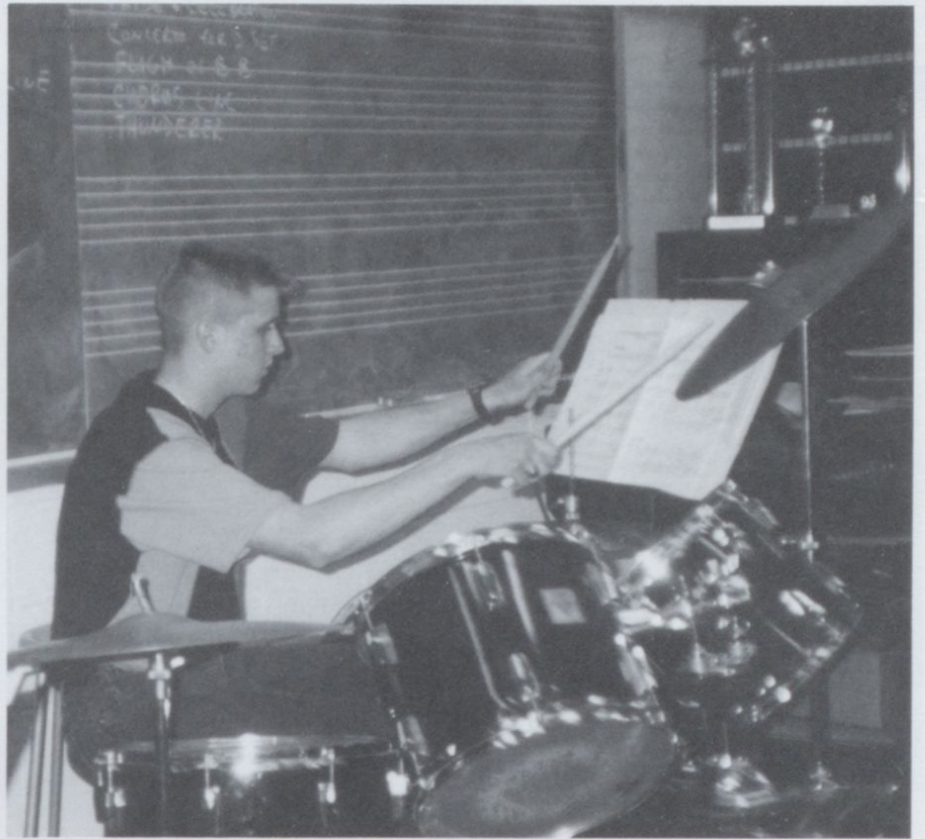

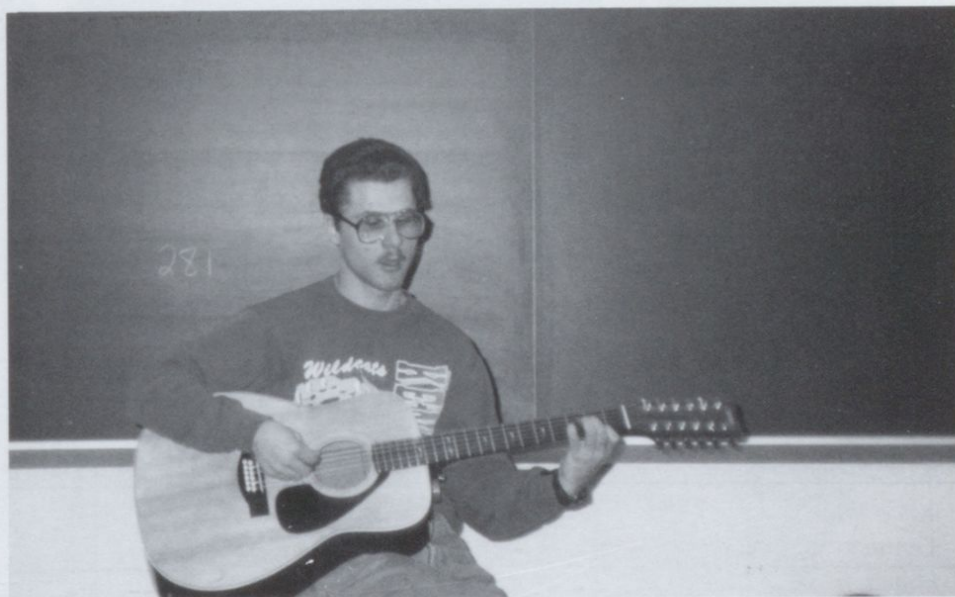
