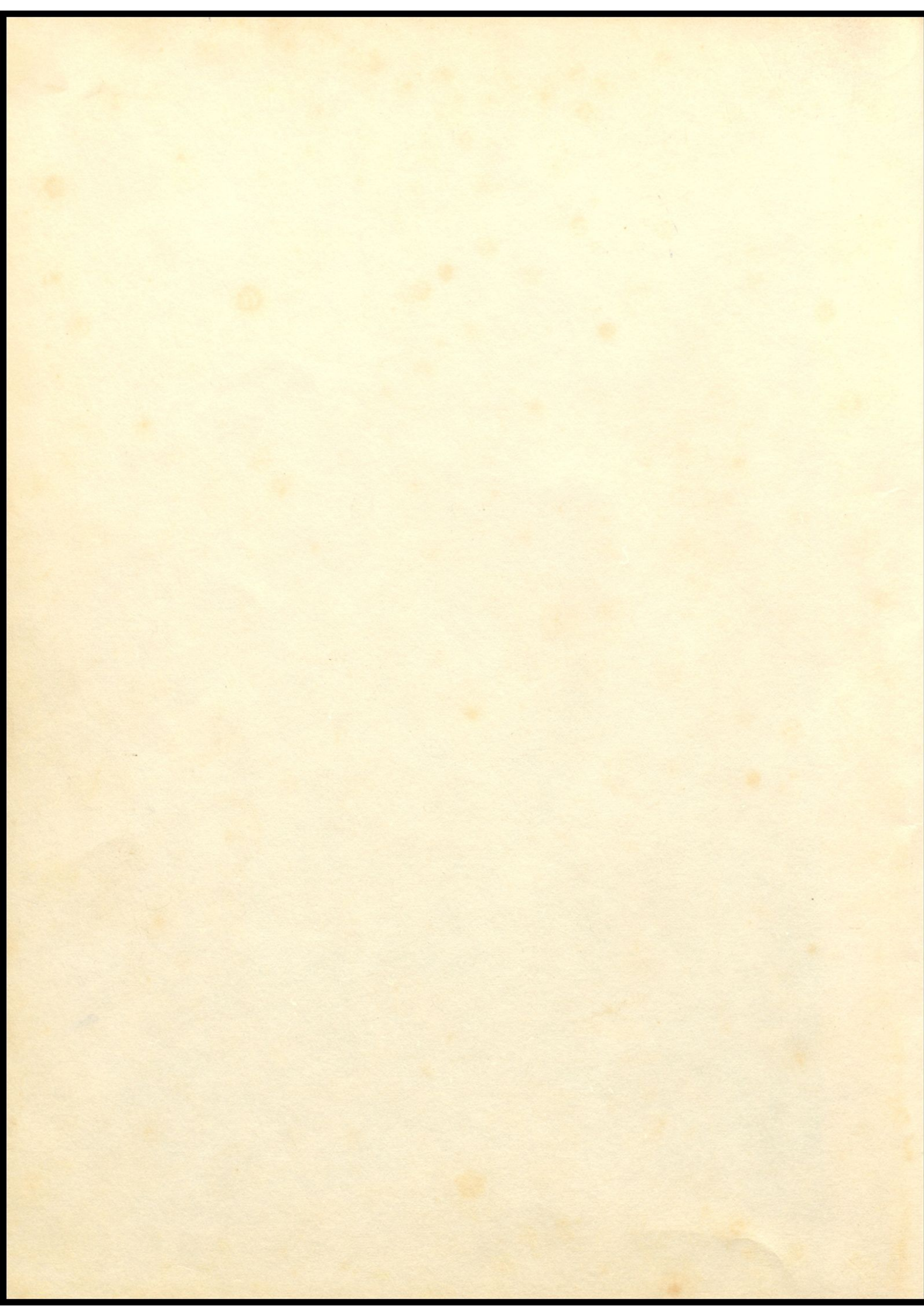



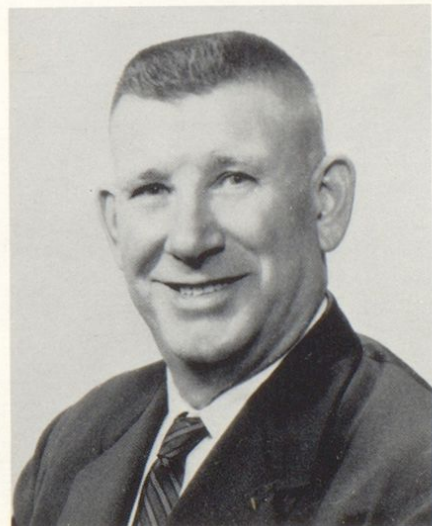
## *Board of Education*
